

CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ESQUIMALT

BY-LAW NO. 410

For the purpose of stopping up and closing
a portion of the Highway known as Grafton
Street.

WHEREAS the building situate on Lot Thirty-two (32), Esquimalt District, Plan 1428, encroaches upon Grafton Street for a distance of five (5) feet, it appearing that the error arose by reason of the fact that according to original survey records, that part of Grafton Street, contiguous to the parcel mentioned was intended to be a twenty-five (25) foot street and later was changed to thirty (30) Feet.

AND WHEREAS Grafton Street is abounded at its southern extremity by lands of the Department of National Defence, there being no access to tidal waters by egress thereto from Grafton Street.

AND WHEREAS one Gertrude Huntley Green the owner of the said lands and premises namely, Lot Thirty-two (32), Esquimalt District, Plan 1428, is desirous of perfecting here title to the lands and premises upon which the improvements to the same lie, and to enable her to secure title thereto, seeks to have the five (5) feet of Grafton Street, which abuts upon the east boundary of the said lot, throughout its length and which is shown outlined in red on the plan attached hereto, stopped up and closed.

NOW THEREFORE the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Esquimalt enacts as follows:

1. That the five (5) feet of Grafton Street abutting on the eastern boundary of Lot Thirty-two (32), Esquimalt District, Plan 1428 throughout its length and shown outlined in red on the plan attached hereto, be and the same is hereby stopped up and closed.
2. This By-Law may be cited as the "Grafton Street Partial Closing By-Law."

PASSED the Municipal Council on the 3rd day of July, 1945.

RECONSIDERED, ADOPTED AND FINALLY PASSED the Municipal Council this 16th day of July, 1945.
