

CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF ESQUIMALT

BY-LAW No. 825

BEING a By-law to authorize the purchase by the Corporation of Lots 3 and 4, Section 11, Esquimalt District, Plan 391.

The Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Township of Esquimalt enacts as follows:

1. That the Corporation shall acquire from Patrick Joseph Mulcahy of 2491 Central Avenue, in the City of Victoria in the Province of British Columbia, for the price or consideration of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.) in lawful money of Canada, all and singular that certain parcel or tract of land lying, being and situate in the Municipality of the Township of Esquimalt and more particularly known and described as Lots 3 and 4, Section 11, Esquimalt District, Plan 391, the same being required for the purposes of the Corporation.
3. That this By-law may be cited for all purposes as "Land Acquisition By-law (No. 4) 1958".
