Mary Lim, the first female welder at Yarrows Shipyard



As the Victoria Daily times reported, "it's women's war, too - women work alongside men in western Canadian shipyards" (April 10, 1944).

Mary Lim became the first qualified female electric welder in the Blacksmith shop at Yarrows Ltd. Yarrows' president praised her as "one of the best welders we have". She started her welding career in November 1942, when the yard first began employing

women workers.

At its peak during World War II, Yarrow employed about 480 women. Her skills played a vital role in selecting her for launching the frigate HMCS Capilano from Yarrow Yard No. 01 on April 8, 1944.

This archival photo shows that Ms. Lim carries a bouquet and a bottle of Champagne to launch the ship.

A photo print of Mary Lim (025–143–099) from Yarrows' collection, donated to the Esquimalt Municipal Archives in 1994, reveals many facets of history. She symbolizes the history of female shipyard workers and skilled female workers in Esquimalt's maritime history.

Her ethnic background highlights the cultural diversity of Esquimalt and represents a memorable chapter in the inclusive history of the area.

Financial planning & budget meetings

Staff present a draft budget to Council and the public for feedback and adjustments in the spring. Budget meetings are scheduled in late 2025 so that residents know when to expect budget information and input opportunities.

The annual budget outlines both operational needs and capital projects. Council takes council priorities into account when approving the budget to ensure initiatives are responsibly funded. The resulting Five-Year Financial Plan provides funding for core services as well as the Council Priorities Plan.

Council invites feedback from the public about spending priorities as they consider the 2026 budget and resulting taxes needed to implement the budget.

Short Term Rentals in Esquimalt

Short-term rentals are currently prohibited in Esquimalt without special rezoning and owners complying with legacy "Bed and Breakfast" regulations.

The township is working to update its bylaws to better

As a first step, we'd like to better understand resident and business views on the potential impacts of short-term rentals like Airbnb – both positive and negative.

Your feedback will inform a Short-Term Rental Options Report that will go to Council in early 2026, with opportunities to provide additional input.

GET READY FOR STORM SEASON

For the fall and winter season in Esquimalt, residents should prepare for potential storm related flooding from heavy rains and possible snowfall. It is also important for all residents to have emergency plans and kits for self-sufficiency, as storms can cause power outages.

Here's how you can help when storms hit:

During periods of heavy rain, please clear leaves and debris away from storm drains near your home to allow excess water to drain rather than pooling on streets and properties.

After a snowfall, please do your part to keep the township safe and accessible by clearing snow and ice from the sidewalk along your property, business, or home. This is a requirement under the Streets & Traffic Regulation Bylaw.
