HMCS ESQUIMALT

HMCS Esquimalt (J272) was a Bangor class minesweeper that was commissioned on the 26th of October 1942 and served in the Royal Canadian Navy during World War II.

The Esquimalt served on the Atlantic coast of Canada conducting anti-submarine patrols in the approaches to Halifax Harbour. She was torpedoed and sunk off Cheducto Head, Noav Scotia by U-190 on 16 April 1945, becoming the last RCN warship lost to enemy action in World War II.
