# **BACKGROUND:**

Section 148 of the *Local Government Act* provides that within 30 days after the declaration of official election results, the Chief Election Officer must submit a report of the election results to the local government. The report must include a compilation of the information on the ballot accounts for the election.

Section 149 of the Act requires that within 30 days after the elected candidates have taken office, the

names of the elected officials must be submitted to the BC Gazette for publication. Staff confirms that the required information has been submitted to the Gazette.

# ISSUES:

   This Staff Report is in compliance with the requirements of the Local Government Act regulating the conduct of local government elections, including required reporting of results.
- Organizational Implications
  There are no organizational implications.
- 3. Financial Implications
  There are no financial implications.
- 4. Sustainability & Environmental Implications
  There are no sustainability or environmental implications.
- 5. Communication & Engagement Following the close of the polls on General Voting Day on November 15, 2014, the unofficial results of the election were posted on the Township's website and provided to CivicInfo BC and to the local media. The School Trustee election results were provided to the Chief Election Officer of School District 61.

On November 17<sup>th</sup>, the Declaration of Official Election Results was completed and the information was posted on the website and provided to Elections BC. The official election results were submitted to the BC Gazette for publication as required by the *Local Government Act*. This Report to the Township Council is the final step in the mandatory reporting requirements set out in the *Act*.
