
## Core Services/Service Areas

- Total FTE = 4.8

### 2016 Achievements

#### Emergency Management

- Preparedness presentations to @ 200 people
- Quake Cottage over 300 participants
- Participate in Exercise "Coastal Response" and major Evacuation Exercise

#### Bylaw Enforcement

- Remedial Action Process Unsightly Property Demolition
- Special Enforcement Action Civil Injunction
- Animal Management Completed comprehensive deer survey
- 645 investigative files 202 Bylaw Offence Notices issued totalling @ \$12,500



### 2016 Achievements

#### Building Inspection

- Enhanced process improves turnaround times for issuance of building permits
- 102 Building permits issued with a total construction value in excess of \$19,000,000
- 70 Plumbing permits issued

#### Business Licensing

- New process results in 1 to 3 day turnaround time for simple business licence
- 707 active business licences (increase of 25 over previous year)



## Key Challenges

- Short term
  - Increased complexity of investigations limiting unrestricted patrol time in parks and public places
- Longer term
  - Safety and health concerns related to nuisance properties
  - Integrating local government priorities into the Regional Emergency Management Partnership



### 2017 Initiatives

- Enhancing public safety in parks and public areas (Healthy and Liveable Community)
- Increased focus on enforcement initiatives relating to chronic unsightly properties (Healthy and Liveable Community)
- Enhancing Community safety through citizen engagement and training in Rapid/Neighbourhood Damage Assessment and Evacuation planning (Key Relationships)
