## **Projects on the Go in the Township**

In the coming months, watch for some new developments taking shape in the Township. Here's just a few projects on the go:

#### **Esquimalt Town Square**



Esquimalt Town Square, a proposed revitalization project located on land directly south and west of Municipal Hall, is envisioned to be a lively and sustainable town centre. Three bylaws which will pave the way for development of the project were adapted by Council at its July 11, 2016 meeting. Construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2017 and be completed within two years. Esquimalt Town Square will be a catalyst for development for years to come in the Township.

#### **Esquimalt Adventure Park**



With Council approval, construction and playground installation contracts for the Fraser Street Adventure Park have been awarded. The site— owned by the Township— has been rezoned to ensure park facilities can be located at optimum locations. The estimated date for completion is early 2017 with the water fixture component ready for use in the summer of 2017.

#### English Inn



The English Inn is a renowned boutique hotel on Lampson Street in Esquimalt located on 1.5 acres of gardens. The Inn will be expanding in the future to include upgrades to the main heritage building, additional rooms and a spa. The project will include a residential development, providing 180 residential units over four phases. The development application was received June 30, 2016 and will be reviewed by the Esquimalt Advisory Design Review Committee in July, 2016. **Red Barn Market** 



Red Barn Markets, a locally owned and operated business, will become a part of the commercial district at Admirals and Esquimalt - at the former site of the government liquor store - in the spring of 2017. The business is going ahead as a retail partnership with the Songhees Nation, which assumed ownership of the property three years ago. The Development Permit and Development Variance Permit were approved by Council on July 11, 2016.

Other projects to watch for in the coming months include the Tudor House project at Admirals and Esquimalt Road, the West Bay Triangle Lands in West Bay, and a 30-unit residential project at 826 Esquimalt Road. Watch for a new development tracker addition to www.esquimalt.ca later in 2016.



## **A New Vision for Esquimalt Road**

The Township of Esquimalt, as part of its ongoing efforts in supporting revitalization and beautification initiatives along Esquimalt Road, has issued a Request for Proposals to develop a set of design guidelines for the historic corridor.

Specific guidelines will be developed around such themes as design connectivity with major cross roads (Head Street and Admirals Road), street furniture, innovative technologies,

identification of appropriate building heights in specific locations, and detailed sidewalk design.

The project will also include branding and marketing of the corridor renewal, a cost breakdown on proposed improvements, and engineering implications for design elements.

"Eventually, most of the elements of the guidelines will be incorporated into our Official Community Plan," said Director of Development Services Bill Brown.

Once in place, the guidelines will extend over the entire length of Esquimalt Road within Esquimalt's boundaries from Canteen Road at the western terminus to Dominion Road at the eastern border with the City of Victoria.

An extensive public consultation program — face-to-face and online — will be a key part of the process, allowing property and business owners along Esquimalt Road to provide input.

Consultation will also be conducted with the City of Victoria to ensure that there is a coordinated suite of design guidelines along the entire length of Esquimalt Road through both municipalities.

## ...and an upgrade!

With Council approval on July 4, 2016, a \$495,000 upgrade to Esquimalt Road will proceed during the summer of 2016. The successful bidder for the work was G & E Contracting Limited.

The corridor from Lampson to Head Street will be upgraded with new surfacing and line painting, and new traffic signals will be installed at the intersection of Lampson and Esquimalt Road. Existing bike lanes will be maintained.

Construction activity will cause some short-term traffic disruptions and the Township appreciates the patience of residents and commuters while the work is being completed. Please reduce speed and watch for traffic controllers.

The project is expected to be completed by the end of September 2016.



# **Community Consultation Roundup - Official Community Plan Review**

## Looking Forward Forum

Thank you to everyone who attended the May 4<sup>th</sup> Looking Forward Forum and completed a paper or online survey. More than 50 people attended the forum to share their ideas with staff and Council members. In total, 221 completed surveys were received with a number of suggestions for moving Esquimalt forward over the next 10, 20 and 30 years. The Township also consulted with over 180 youth attending local schools, or participating in Esquimalt's teen centre program.

All of the input received will be considered by staff when reviewing and updating policies for Esquimalt's Official Community Plan (OCP) in the following areas: arts, culture & heritage, community health & safety, economic development, the environment, parks, trails & recreation, planning & development, and transportation & infrastructure. The review process began in the fall of 2015 and is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2017 with the adoption of an updated OCP. Survey results will be available at esquimalt.ca in the late summer of 2016.

### Age-friendly Assessment

This spring the Township undertook an age-friendly assessment to ensure it is a community where older adults are supported to live active, socially engaged, and independent lives. A community workshop and survey were conducted as well as several focus groups with service providers, caregivers and older adults. In total, over 328 people participated in the assessment process. The study, funded by UBCM's *Seniors' Housing & Support Initiative*,



will recommend goals, objectives and policies on creating an age-friendly community for consideration in the review and update of the OCP. The final report will be presented to Council on August 15<sup>th</sup> and posted to the website.

Acceptable compost materials include leaves, branches up to 3" in diameter, grass clipping and soft garden materials. Rock, concrete and soils are not accepted.
