Admirals Road Open House Scheduled for November 21st


he Township's Engineering Department is moving ahead with the second design phase of the Admirals Corridor Improvement Project.

Public comments on the project were received through an open house held at Municipal Hall on June 13th, 2013, and through one-on-one opportunities offered to the public during the month of July. The majority of responses (81%) expressed support for the project. "As a result of this valuable feedback, and through some fine tuning, we have a more complete design we would like to share with the public," said Engineering Manager Will Wieler.

The new design will be presented at a second open house at Municipal Hall on Thursday November 21st, 2013 between 5:30 and 7:30 p.m. The public is invited to review the design and provide more input into the final corridor plan at that time. Engineering staff will be on hand to answer questions.

While the project has mandatory components in order to comply with funding requirements—such as bike lanes, lane modifications and roadway repairs—there are design elements that can be modified based on public input.

"The public definitely has a say on the final look of the corridor," said Wieler. "Within our budget, we are doing the best we can to provide a safe and efficient corridor for all users, and we

value ideas from the community in finalizing the project design."

Among the innovations being considered for the corridor are raised buffers for sections of bike lanes, changing street lighting to energy efficient LED technology from standard high pressure sodium, and possibly relocating overhead electrical to underground between Esquimalt Road and Woodway Road.

Construction is expected to begin in the late spring of 2014.

Improvements to Admirals Road in Esquimalt will enhance safety and access for all modes of transportation. The project is proceeding thanks to a \$2.8 million contribution from the Government of Canada through the Gas Tax Fund for municipal infrastructure priorities.

Garbage Collection Changes Coming in 2014

In early 2014, the Township of Esquimalt will be changing the way it collects garbage in two important ways. Firstly, in addition to garbage, kitchen scraps will be picked up by Public Works crews. This means that residents will be required to sort kitchen scraps from their garbage using supplied bins.

Secondly, crews will be picking up material from the curbside, not the backyard, using specialized semiautomatic trucks capable of collecting both waste streams. This means that homeowners will need to locate bins at the curbside by 7 a.m. on pickup days.



Residents will be provided with specialized bins—freeof-charge—by the Township: two large 121 litre bins

for waste (grey bin with grey lid) and kitchen scraps (grey bin with green lid), as well as a smaller under-the-counter tote for collecting kitchen scraps inside the home.

The Township will take delivery of the new trucks—which replace vehicles that are at the end of their operational lives—in early 2014. The new bins have also been ordered by the Township and are expected to be delivered at the same time.

Two public information sessions were held last summer on June 19th and July 4th to provide information updates. **If you missed these sessions, a third information session will be scheduled before the end of the year.** Residents are urged to attend to find out more about the new waste management system. Public Works staff will be on hand to answer questions.

Park and Facility Upgrades

The Township is undergoing several upgrades this fall, including a refurbishment of Memorial Park and comprehensive renovations to the Esquimalt Recreation Centre.

Roomier, Safer and More Attractive Recreation Centre

Work at the Recreation Centre includes a new entry vestibule, reception area, enhancements to the atrium, installation of new flooring and the addition of a multipurpose room.

Visitors to the Centre in the coming months will see improved lighting, and an upgraded atrium more suited to public gatherings. The pool-side viewing area is being converted into a multi-purpose room with folding doors so that atrium space can be increased for large public meetings.

The kitchen area will be refitted to allow the addition of new cooking and craft programs, and new flooring, lighting and counters will be added to the adjacent Senior's Room.

"We are looking forward to the completion of this improvement project," said Manager of Parks and Facilities Rick Daykin. "We have had to make some big adjustments during construction and we thank our patrons for their patience."

The renovation project is expected to be completed by December 1st, 2013.

Memorial Park: Rich History, Modern Refurbishments

Memorial Park will be open for Remembrance Day on November 11th with several new additions. In addition to drainage work, landscaping and improved lighting, the park upgrade includes a new central walkway to the cenotaph with



pavers matching the shoulder entryways, a symbolic poppy paver design (above), and a heritage-themed entranceway with pillars reconstructed to match the shoulder entries.

"This upgrade improves the appearance of the park while respecting its historic status," said Daykin. "It also enhances the park's greenspace and protects the root systems of existing trees."

The park, established in 1924 to commemorate soldiers killed in World War I, was designated an heritage site in 1995, the first such designation in the Township. Remembrance Day ceremonies are held at the cenotaph every year. (See community event calendar on page 4.)

Centennial Walkway Update

As part of the Memorial Park upgrade, Phase II centennial walkway dedication pavers— a total of 32 inscribed pavers—have been

installed. Do you wish to honour a family member, friend, organization or pioneer with a paving stone? Phase III of the paver project is now underway with a tentative installation of spring 2014.

Licence Renewal Reminder

At the end of December 2013, the Township will be mailing out renewal notices for 2014 business and dog licences.

Business owners are encouraged to renew their business licences by January 31st, 2014. After that date an additional licence fee of \$25.00 will be applied. Has there been a change in your business this year? If so, please contact Municipal Hall at 250-414-7157 so we can update our records. Failure to renew a business licence is an offence under the Township's Business Bylaw No. 2482, which provides for fines ranging from \$500.00 to \$2,000.00.

In Esquimalt, all dogs over the age of four months must be licensed. Dog licences ensure owner accountability, and provide identification for your dog. Licences go on sale each year at the end of December and are valid from the date of issue until December 31st the following year. A discount of \$5.00 applies to payments on dog licences received by January 31st, 2014. Pay by mail or in person at Municipal Hall.
