WW1 Trophy Guns Being Restored

The two WW1 trophy guns in Memorial Park are being refurbished as part of the Township's commemoration of the 100th anniversary of the First World War.

Mike Reed, logistics supervisor with the Public Works Department, is leading the effort to restore the guns, which came into Township possession in 1920 from the federal Commission of War Records and Trophies.

The restoration project will involve replacing missing parts, repairing damaged and rusted components, and cleaning, coating, and re-painting the guns using the original German colours and pattern. Once refurbished, the guns will be re-mounted in the park with recessed lighting in the summer of 2014.

New Garbage Collection System Kicks Off

Starting in early March, the Township of Esquimalt began picking up sorted waste—garbage and kitchen scraps—from residents. In addition, waste is now being picked up from the curb, rather than the backyard. Most residents should now have two bins for sorting waste and a third small bin for collecting kitchen scraps under the counter.



Q and A – Solid Waste Collection Program

Q. I am concerned about pests, such as raccoons, getting into my bin. What should I do?

A. *Bungee cords to secure bin lids for both kitchen scraps and garbage are available at Municipal Hall.*

Q. What kind of bags should I use in the bins, and where do I get them?

A. *Standard garbage bags can be used for your outdoor garbage bin. For your outdoor kitchen scraps bin, you can choose to use compostable bags, or to place organics loosely in the bin. The latter approach will likely require rinsing out the bin after each pickup. Compostable bags are available at most grocery and hardware stores. Lining your under-the-sink kitchen catcher is optional. If you choose to line this container you can use newspaper, paper bags or compostable bags. All of these options are acceptable in the kitchen scraps bin (green lid).*

Q. Can I have a second bin for garbage?

A. *If the garbage bin provided by the Township does not meet your needs, you may use your old bin for additional garbage, but a tag is required. Garbage tags can be purchased from Municipal Hall or the Recreation Centre at a cost of four for \$8.*

From our Archives: Colville Road Circa 1942

The expansion of Yarrows Shipyard and HMC Dockyard, to meet wartime ship building demands, brought hundreds of workers to Esquimalt who needed houses. The Dominion government incorporated Wartime Housing Limited to oversee construction and ordered Esquimalt to deed 275 lots to the Crown for \$1 per lot. By 1943, 100 permits, mostly along Colville and Lockley roads, had been issued for construction. Many of these houses, designed by architect P. Leonard James, remain today.

These historic photographs of houses under construction on Colville Road were recently transferred to the Esquimalt Archives by the City of Victoria Archives.

Blair comes to the community from Comox, where he served as Officer in Charge at the Comox Valley Detachment of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police. He has 27 years community safety experience working in leadership roles with the RCMP in both Alberta and British Columbia, and holds a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from the University of Saskatchewan.

Economic Development Roundtable Seeks Your Input

After several meetings with local economic sectors over the past year, the Township's Economic Development Roundtable will be seeking wider public input this spring. This input will be sought in community forums being hosted on April 23rd and 26th and through an online survey being made available on www.esquimalt.ca from April 14th to May 10th, 2014.

Information from the roundtable and the community forums will be used to develop an Economic Development Strategy, which Esquimalt Council has identified as one of its strategic priorities.

During 2013 roundtable sessions were conducted with representatives from small business, tourism, development, education/training, shipbuilding and defence, environment/green economy, arts and culture, and health and wellness.

As of January 2014 all eight sector roundtables have been completed. Each sector completed a SWOT (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats) analysis on various issues facing their sector in Esquimalt. At a follow-up meeting, participants provided a series of policies, goals, strategies and actions that they feel would help the sector flourish in the Township. Staff has been summarizing this data for public review and is now looking for input from the community.

"We have spent a great deal of time in discussions with a variety of sectors, getting stakeholder input into our local economy" said Bill Brown, director of development services. "We are now entering a public consultation phase where we want input from the wider community."

The community forums will consist of facilitated sit-down table top discussions for each of the eight sector topics. Each table top discussion will be limited to 45 minutes of conversation based on the supplied sector backgrounder report and survey. No sign-up is necessary.
