Organizers are encouraging everyone to come out in their most patriotic red and white attire to take part in the Olympic Torch Celebrations.

# Tourism Strategy in Full Swing Twenty Tourism Themes Identified in the Township

If you think you know Esquimalt, you may not know of "My Esquimalt." My Esquimalt is the title of the Township's recently launched tourism strategy. The new promotional material features stunning photography in the form of a brochure, walking tours and an official tourism website.

"The 2009 strategy is the second phase in developing and promoting tourism in Esquimalt", said Barbara Snyder, director of development services. "In the first phase in 2008 we did an assessment of our strengths and weaknesses and developed a Tourism Action Plan. "My Esquimalt" is part of the implementation of the 2008 Plan."

To implement the plan, consultant Gary McCartie was hired to develop the overall approach and the necessary promotional materials, including the website, brochures, walking tour maps, rack cards, and distribution channels for these materials.

At the core of the tourism strategy is a framework of 20 different themes representing what Esquimalt has to offer and why it represents a valuable visitor experience. Being "foot friendly" is one of these 20 themes. To promote this theme, a seven-part series of self-guided walking tours with accompanying brochures was developed. The tours, written by fifth-generation resident and local historian Sherri Robinson, include maps, photos and a historical description of Esquimalt's past.

Funding for the development of Esquimalt's tourism strategy came from the Union of BC Municipalities' Community Tourism Program.

The audit inventoried the existing accessibility conditions in the community, and identified issues and opportunities to improve accessibility and inclusion for people with disabilities. The report includes an implementation strategy to help make the community a model for accessibility and inclusiveness. The audit was made possible by a \$20,000 grant from the 2010 Legacies Now Society. The Township contracted the Social Planning and Research Council of BC to conduct the audit and write a report. Township Staff and members of the Access Awareness Committee participated in the project.

# BizPaL Makes Life Easier for Businesses in Esquimalt

In an effort to improve customer service for local businesses, the Township now provides access to BizPaL (Business Permits and Licences Service) through its own website.

BizPaL is a web-based service that allows business clients to easily generate a customized list of the permits and licences they require from three levels of government —local, provincial and federal —by answering some simple questions.

This service is a collaborative effort between the Government of Canada and participating provincial/territorial, regional, and municipal governments.

#### **2010 License Renewals**

At the end of December 2009, the Township will be mailing out renewal notices for 2010 business and dog licenses.

Residents and business owners are encouraged to renew their business licenses by January 29, 2010. After that date an additional license fee of 10% (with a minimum fee of \$25.00) will be applied. Failure to renew a business license is an offence under the Township's Business Bylaw No. 2482, which provides for fines.

A discount of \$5.00 applies for payments on dog licenses received by January 29, 2010. For more information or to report any changes to your license, contact the Municipal Hall at 250-414-7100.
