Along with municipalities around the province, the Township of Esquimalt will be holding a civic election on November 15, 2014. Esquimalt residents will vote to elect a Mayor, six Councillors and nine School Trustees in the election.

The election will include two non-binding questions on the ballot:

- 1. Are you in favour of the Township of Esquimalt exploring options to achieve efficiencies by further sharing some services with other municipalities? "YES" or "NO"
- 2. Are you in favour of exploring the reduction of the number of municipalities within Greater Victoria through amalgamation? "YES" or "NO"

Archives to Move Images Online with Capturing Our History Project

History meets modern technology with the Esquimalt Archives' Capturing Our History Project. Some 2000 images depicting the Township, its people and its history have been digitized and will be made available for online viewing starting this fall.

The goal of the project—partially funded by a \$9000 grant from the Irving K. Barber Learning Centre at the University of British Columbia— was to bring to life on the Internet historical images of Esquimalt from the past 150 years.

Township Launches Webcasting of Council Meetings

he Township launched webcasting of Council meetings at its Monday October 20th Council meeting. Residents interested in civic matters will now be able to view live and archived videos of Council meetings from the comfort of their own homes using their home computer, or on the road with their mobile device.

A link is now available on the Township home page which will redirect web visitors to a centralized portal. As content is added to the portal, users will be able to access not only videos, but supporting documents such as agendas, minutes, staff reports and presentations. Archived videos will be indexed, allowing viewers to jump to subjects of interest quickly, rather than watching the entire meeting. Users can also subscribe to an RSS feed and share content through social media.

"This is another step forward in our public engagement initiative, a Council

strategic priority," said CAO Laurie Hurst. "Residents and citizens will be able to stay informed of Council decisions with relative ease, and choose to watch entire meetings or only items that are of particular interest to them."

The webcasting initiative is part of a broader Township citizen engagement platform which includes a paperless agenda management system. The new technologies will be managed by Township staff members, who have been trained over the past several weeks by open government software developer Granicus Inc. The initiative will reduce staff time in processing meeting information while increasing public access and transparency.

Admirals Road Corridor Improvement Update

A fter several months of planning, public consultation and design work, the Admirals Road Corridor Improvement Project is scheduled to begin in the late spring of 2015. The project, part of the Township's commitment to safe multi-modal transportation for residents and commuters, is proceeding thanks to a \$2.8 million contribution from the Government of Canada through the Gas Tax Fund for municipal infrastructure priorities.

The project will improve the busy commuter route between Maplebank Road and Lyall Street with the addition of bike lanes, improved sidewalks, a twoway left turn lane, median islands, and street lighting upgrades. The project will also help to protect local waterways with the installation of stormwater treatment devices and the separation of combined manholes for storm and sanitary collection systems.

"We will be making every effort to

minimize impacts to residents and commuters during construction," said Jeff Miller, Director of Engineering and Public Works. "But some impacts such as noise, dust, and traffic delays will be unavoidable at times."

During construction, the Township is committed to keeping the public informed through:

- A dedicated project information page and e-mail subscription for project updates at www.esquimalt. ca
- Scheduled meetings with residents fronting Admirals in early 2015
- Regular project updates through local media, social media and the Township website

A map showing detour options for cyclists during construction will also be provided on the Township website.

The Admirals Road Corridor Improvement Project is expected to be completed in late 2015.

Extra Bins Available for Purchase at Hall

For those residents who require a second garbage bin for either garbage or kitchen scraps, starting November 3, 2014 the Township is now offering the opportunity to



purchase a second regulation bin. These bins are designed to be used with the Township's semi-automated garbage trucks.

Starting January 1, 2015 refuse collectors will no longer collect refuse from non-regulation garbage bins, in keeping with the Township's *Solid Waste Collection and Disposal Bylaw 2815*.

Residents who purchase a second regulation bin are reminded that the second bin will be considered extra garbage and an extra garbage sticker will need to be

attached to the bin. Bins can be purchased at the Municipal Hall, 1229 Esquimalt Road for \$95.00 each. This cost includes assembly, delivery within two days of purchase, and a bungee cord for securing the lid against animals, birds and the weather.

Additional purchased bins will be the property of the resident, who will therefore take responsibility for bin maintenance.

A Guiding Document: Esquimalt's Economic Development Strategy

The Township of Esquimalt Economic Development Strategy was approved by Council at its meeting on October 27, 2014. The document was shaped over two years through input from industry, local businesses, community groups and residents. Eight separate economic sector roundtables each developed a SWOT (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats) analysis and recommended actions to encourage sustainable economic growth in the economy. This information was reviewed by the wider community – and input was encouraged - through two community forums and online surveys. Coordination and development of the document and strategy was completed in-house using Township staff.

The strategy is comprised of 15 unique strategies targeting four focus areas for action: business attraction and retention, commercial and industrial revitalization, community image, and quality of life. In total there are 93 distinct actions to be implemented over the next five years.

"The document reflects input from a variety of sectors, organizations and individuals," said Director of Development Services Bill Brown. "We look forward to working with our community partners and residents in further developing Esquimalt's economy."

The Esquimalt Chamber of Commerce is expected to lead some aspects of the strategy, such as a shop local campaign, and some actions have already been completed including a hosted bus tour of Esquimalt by local realtors.

Considered to be a "living document" Council will update the strategy annually as part of its strategic planning and progress on the implementation of the four focus areas will be monitored regularly.

Capturing our History

No longer limited to file folders, bankers' boxes and albums, the images will be available for free online viewing by anyone from anywhere in the world. "It is gratifying to see so many of our photographs come to life for the first time in a digital format," said Municipal Archivist Greg Evans. "The image bank will be of interest not only to residents and the general public, but also to authors, educators and historians, among others."

Museum and archives consultant Patrick Craib and digitization consultant Emma Hughes scanned the original photographs – many of them in a fragile state – and created a database of information for all of the images. The images and database were then input into a specialized archives software program. The final step is to upload the data to the web and link to the Township's website.

Evans noted that the department would be adding more images to the online archive on an ongoing basis in the coming years, as more photographs from the existing collection are uploaded.
