

## Admirals Road Upgrade: Have Your Say

Some 60 people attended a public open house on the Admirals Corridor Improvement Project on June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2013 at Esquimalt Municipal Hall. Township engineering staff is soliciting input into the final design of the project, which includes the addition of bike lanes, a two-way left turn lane, median islands, street lighting upgrades, sidewalk improvements, and the installation of stormwater treatment devices.

“The feedback we received at the open house was mostly positive,” said Engineering Manager Will Wieler, adding that there is some concern from individuals about median islands and bike lanes reducing traffic flow and creating more congestion.

Township traffic studies show that the Admirals corridor within Esquimalt will not dramatically change as a result of adding safety features such as bike lanes or median islands. However, median islands are not a mandatory part of the final design and alternatives will be considered after reviewing public feedback.

For those who were not able to attend the June 13<sup>th</sup> open house, more public input opportunities are planned, including one-on-one meetings between engineering staff and residents during the month of July. Meetings can be scheduled by calling Esquimalt Engineering and Public Works at 250-414-7108. There is also an open house scheduled for November, 2013.

## Reorganization Emphasizes Community Safety

The Township of Esquimalt is reorganizing several departments and adding a Director of Community Safety Services. The current functions of bylaw enforcement, building inspection and emergency preparedness will be reassigned to this department. The Township has begun the process of recruiting for the director position.

“We believe that a Community Safety Services Department will create a service hub with a more focussed and coordinated approach to community safety,” said Chief Administrative Officer Laurie Hurst. “The reorganization will result in more responsive and efficient operations across all departments.”

This consolidation of services addresses a strategic initiative identified earlier by Council to coordinate public safety and is ultimately focused on improving the quality of life for all residents.

The Director of Community Safety Services will oversee community risk assessment and analysis, liaise with police services and provide oversight to policing contract management, and work closely with community partners to protect, preserve and improve public safety in the community.

The reorganization will relieve workload issues in a number of departments. Communications and human resources staff will now report to Corporate Services, and sustainability staff to Development Services.

# Moving Ahead with New Garbage Collection System

In February 2013, Esquimalt Council voted to proceed with a new garbage collection system with two major changes: 1) collection of kitchen scraps as part of the Regional Kitchen Scraps Strategy, and 2) switching from backyard to curbside pickup using new trucks capable of collecting both garbage and kitchen scraps.

The new program is scheduled to go into effect in early 2014 when the Township takes delivery of the new garbage trucks. Information sessions were held on June 19<sup>th</sup> and July 4<sup>th</sup> in Council Chambers, and another one is planned for the fall of 2013. These sessions provide opportunities for public input, including input on exemptions to curbside pickup for those with mobility challenges.

Using CRD estimates of organic material contained in unsorted garbage, the Township would be diverting approximately 510 tonnes of waste material per year from the Hartland Landfill while also decreasing greenhouse gas emissions. Kitchen scraps will be banned from the landfill by January 1, 2015.

According to Jeff Miller, Director of Engineering and Public Works, it is important to move ahead with kitchen scraps diversion. "Loads that have been separated will be charged \$20 less per ton at Hartland Landfill in 2013/2014," said Miller. "In addition there will be a 20 per cent surcharge on garbage loads containing kitchen scraps in 2014, so it



makes both financial and environmental sense to move forward with the initiative."

Switching from backyard to curbside pickup of garbage is safer and more efficient for crews, and avoids problems associated with entering private backyards, including difficult or unsafe terrain, startling residents or intruding on their privacy, and potentially dangerous encounters with pets.

The Township is currently in preliminary discussions with the City of Victoria to use its transfer station for kitchen scraps and garbage streams, which would lower truck travel times and associated equipment costs. Staff is expected to report to Council regarding specialized garbage and kitchen scraps collection bins on July 15, 2013.

# Township Receives Regreening Grant

With the Bloomin' Beautiful contest in full swing the Township has received a helping hand with municipal beautification in the form of a \$10,000 BC Hydro Community Regreening Grant.

The grant helps keep the Township's green spaces attractive and safe for residents and visitors. Township crews will be busy planting attractive low-growing species along boulevards and corridors in the coming weeks. Tree species to be planted include thornless hawthorne, pear, purple leaf plum, and red maple.

According to BC Hydro—which launched the Community Regreening Program in 1998—planting low-growing appropriate species near power lines ensures both healthy urban forests and reliable electrical service.

## Coming Soon! Free Wireless Internet to Extend Throughout Township

From Gorge Park in the north to Macaulay Park in the south, if you're looking for free wireless Internet access in Esquimalt, chances are you'll find it. Shaw Communications will soon be installing wireless equipment on Township infrastructure located in facilities, parks and recreation sites and other locations around the municipality.

"Most people carry a smart phone or tablet these days and it is handy to be able to download—on the spot and with no data charges—a Township map, a recreation centre schedule, or information on local restaurants or businesses," said Mayor Barb Desjardins.

The agreement with Shaw is a five-year non-exclusive deal to access municipal infrastructure, in exchange for free Internet access at 19 locations.

WiFi is currently provided at Municipal Hall, Esquimalt Recreation Centre and Archie Browning Sports Centre by the municipality. Under the agreement, Shaw would provide new equipment at these locations, and expand the service throughout the community, providing support services for the installed equipment. There is no cost to

the municipality; in fact there will be an anticipated savings of \$7000 over the duration of the agreement.

Information Technology Manager Jon Woodland estimates that the equipment will be installed sometime this summer and operational by early fall.

## Memorial Park Upgrades this Summer

Memorial Park improvements are continuing this summer with resurfacing of the main entryway, the addition of pillars to the entrance, and drainage work and regrading to help drain water during periods of heavy rainfall.

The main entry into the park off of Esquimalt Road will be restored up to the cenotaph with brick pavers to match the Centennial 2012 walkway installations completed in 2012. The upgrade will also include the planting of new colourful gardens throughout the park, which was established in 1924 to commemorate soldiers killed in World War I. The project is expected to be completed by October 1, 2013.
