Mayor's Message Much to Look Forward to in Esquimalt this Spring

Westside Solutions Wraps Up Phase One

Westside Solutions, which has been working on wastewater treatment and resource recovery options for westside communities, has completed the first phase of public engagement, which included hosting six open houses in westside communities, and the development of information boards, fact sheets, a website and a public survey.

Over 200 people attended the open houses, held in the westside communities of Langford, Colwood, View Royal, the Songhees First Nation, and Esquimalt. In addition, 345 people completed the wastewater treatment survey, both online and at the open houses. Thank you to everyone who spent the time to share their comments and opinions.

Staff members have collated and summarized information received from the public, which will be combined with technical information that Westside Solutions has requested from the consulting community to develop preliminary options.

Summarized public input has been posted to the Westside Solutions

website, and will inform the next steps in public engagement. This input will ultimately assist in developing wastewater treatment options that will best meet the needs of the community. The framework for Phase 2 public engagement is currently being developed.

Admirals Road Corridor Improvement Update

The Township of Esquimalt has issued a Notice to Tender for the Admirals Road Corridor Improvement Project. Once the project is awarded, the successful contractor will likely begin construction in the spring of 2015 with substantial completion in the fall.

The project will improve the busy commuter route between Maplebank Road and Lyall Street with the addition of bike lanes, a two-way left turn lane, median islands, and upgraded street lighting and sidewalks.

The corridor improvement will also help to protect local waterways with the installation of stormwater treatment devices and the separation of combined manholes for storm and sanitary collection systems.

Crews will make every effort to minimize impacts during construction, but some impacts such as noise, dust, and traffic delays will be unavoidable at times. Advance notice of potential construction impacts to residents and commuters will be made whenever possible.

Improvements to the Admirals Road corridor will enhance safety and access for all modes of transportation. The project is proceeding thanks to a \$2.8 million contribution from the Government of Canada through the Gas Tax Fund for municipal infrastructure priorities.



After several months of renovations Archie Browning Sports Centre will soon be sporting a new look. The upgraded centre will include a new outdoor plaza area, a modern steel facade with a glass curtain wall, as well as a redesigned lobby, board room and office space.

The new outdoor plaza area has been designed as a public performance area, as well as a community space for relaxing and socializing. Once the office space is completed the majority of Parks and Recreation administration staff members now located at the Recreation Centre will move to the Sports Centre. Office space will be open concept with "break out rooms" for meetings.

The upgrade was not without its hiccups. "We ran into unsound wooden beams in the front of the building early in the renovation process," said Parks and Facilities Manager Rick Daykin. "This meant that we had to redesign the entranceway using steel structural materials, which resulted in some delays, but we will have a much stronger building." The project is expected to be completed by late spring.

Revitalization Tax Exemption Open House

The Township will be hosting an open house to gather community input on a proposal to create a Revitalization Tax Exemption Program. The open house will be held on Tuesday, March 24, 2015, from 4 to 8 p.m., at Municipal Hall.

The recently approved Economic **Development Strategy identified a** number of strategies and actions for promoting economic growth in Esquimalt. One of those strategies is the revitalization of Esquimalt Road through facade improvements and beautification using revitalization tax exemptions as an incentive.

The Community Charter provides municipalities with the authority to establish a revitalization tax exemption program bylaw that will exempt approved properties from a portion of their property taxes. Properties currently being considered are commercial, mixed use and multi-family buildings (with four or more units) located between Dominion Road to Canteen Road and within 150 meters of Esquimalt Road.

The open house will be both educational providing examples of revitalization tax exemption programs, as well as engaging, asking for businesses' input on what type of incentives would appeal

Esquimalt Village Project Update

After the completion of several background studies and a market study, Council has asked the Township's Development Services Department to draft a Request for Expression of Interest for the Esquimalt Village Project. This draft document will be presented to Council in the late spring for its consideration.

If approved by Council the Township will issue the Request and begin the process of finding a partner to develop the site, envisioned to be a lively and sustainable town centre, incorporating a mix of uses including an education institution and a new library.

to them. All residents are welcome and a survey will be available online for those who are unable to attend.

Input received will assist staff with the analysis in order to make a recommendation to Council. Staff will be preparing a draft bylaw to present to Council later in the spring. Establishing a bylaw does not in itself guarantee a tax exemption. Owners of eligible property must first make an application to Council and be approved.
