Esquimalt Spearheads Plastic Bag Free Initiative

The Township of Esquimalt has launched an initiative to make itself a plastic bag free community. The plastic bag free campaign is being developed by a group of Royal Roads University students in Environmental Science as part of their course studies. "This is a unique initiative because it involves going out into the community and gathering information directly from residents," said Sustainability Coordinator Marlene Lagoa. "Once a clear picture of consumption habits is gained, a campaign to reduce plastic bag usage will be developed."

Plastic bags have become a major source of pollution in our landfills and in the ocean and require high energy outputs to manufacture and recycle. "This is not about imposing fines or bans," said Lagoa. "The aim is to have residents and businesses voluntarily reduce single plastic bag usage by selecting reusable options.'

Esquimalt's Environmental Advisory Committee analyzed the issue and sent recommendations to Council in the fall of 2009. The Township resolved to implement a voluntary ban by December 31, 2011.

Aside from collecting information in the field, Royal Roads students have developed an online survey. Next steps include designing a recognition program for participating businesses and providing a final report with recommendations to the Township in the fall of 2011.

Species at Risk Survey at Saxe Point

A Macoun's Meadow-foam survey was undertaken in Saxe Point in May to determine the local population size and vigour of this plant species. Macoun's Meadow-foam—a small, white to yellowish-flowered annual herb found in open areas or light open forest—is considered to be a species at risk due to a declining occurrence in the Province of BC. Four populations of the plant known from 1988 have been lost due to human activities associated with residential and tourism development.

The project was led by biologists Todd Kohler and Chris Junck of the Garry Oak Ecosystems Recovery Team, with field work completed by biologist Matt Fairbarns.

The biologists mapped the occurrence of the

plant in Saxe Point using a hand-held GPS unit, identifying threats and habitat requirements for the species. Information gathered will also be of value to the Township to help with site planning and management. The project was funded by Parks Canada and the Habitat Stewardship Program of the Government of Canada.

Heritage Recognition Certificates Presented to Homeowners



Provide your input: Temporary Accessory Structures and Storage Containers



The Township of Esquimalt is looking for input from residents as to whether

temporary tent-like structures (often used to protect cars, boats and trailers) as well as metal storage containers should be permitted and if so, whether they should be regulated in the same way as other accessory buildings such as garages, garden sheds, and workshops are.

The zoning bylaw requires that accessory buildings be sited at least 1.5 metres (5 ft.) from side and rear property lines and that they not be located within front yards. However, temporary accessory structures and cargo containers are being installed throughout the municipality in locations where a regular accessory building would not be allowed and where a building permit would not be issued unless a variance was obtained.

Memorial Walkway Update

According to Centennial Committee Vice Chair Bruce Devitt, people are getting excited about the Memorial Walkway Project, which provides residents and businesses an opportunity to inscribe a personal dedication on a paving stone to be set into the walkway at Memorial Park. "Some 140 people have purchased an inscribed paver so far," said Devitt. "This is almost 25% of the way towards our first target of 600 pavers." Devitt added that inscriptions can honour a departed loved one, a family member, friend, community pioneer, a business, or a community organization or sports team.

Building Memories Project: A Snapshot in Time

It's often been said that every house has a story to tell—about the people who built them, of the times in which they lived and of the character of a community as a whole at any given time.

With Esquimalt's centennial just around the corner in 2012, Municipal Archives plans to embark on a photo inventory of all residences and businesses in the Township. The Building Memories Project will tell a story for future generations, and provide a historical "snapshot" of the residences in our community at this point in time. This photographic record will serve as a valuable research tool and will assist Archives in its efforts to inform the public about the history of the community. The inventory will also become part of the Esquimalt 2012 Centennial legacy.

"We want residents to know that the images we're acquiring are for research and historical purposes only," said Municipal Archivist Gregory Evans, adding that the images will become a secure part of Archives' permanent collection.

Archives volunteer Bill Trayner will be traversing Esquimalt neighbourhoods with his camera starting this summer and hopes to complete the job by the end of 2012.
