Official Community Plan Review Kicks Off

The Township launched its Official Community Plan (OCP) review process on October 23rd, 2015, with an online survey for the public to provide input on key priority areas for community development.

The online survey, available until November 30, 2015 at www.esquimalt.ca, will assist the Township's Development Services Department with planning future community engagement opportunities by identifying areas of particular interest to the public.

"The objective of this plan is to reflect the collective vision of the community heading into the future," said Mayor Barbara Desjardins. "I encourage residents, businesses and community visitors to provide input so that their vision becomes a part of the document."

The OCP is the principal guiding document for all municipal initiatives and activities. The Esquimalt OCP review, a Council strategic priority, will be a multi-phase project over the next two years leading to the adoption of a new Official Community Plan in 2017. The plan's goals, objectives and policies will promote the long-term economic, environmental, social and cultural well-being of the community.

General topics and themes of the OCP include land use, transportation, heritage, parks and recreation, arts and culture, and the environment.

In addition to the survey, the Township has created a resource library portal for the public to find out more about the OCP process and community planning. The resource library, along with the project scope and timeline are available at www.esquimalt.ca/communityplan. The public can also sign up for project updates through an e-mail notification feature on the website home page.

Findings from the survey will be available for the public to review in January 2016 and community engagement opportunities will be scheduled throughout the two-year process.

Esquimalt Village Project Moving Ahead

On October 16, 2015, the Township of Esquimalt issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) for development of the Esquimalt Village Project (EVP).

The EVP is envisioned to be a lively and sustainable town centre, incorporating a mix of uses including retail, residential and office space, inviting open spaces for the public, and a new education facility and library. Formerly the site of the Public Works Yard and original Municipal Hall, it is about 87,000 square feet (0.8 ha) in size and is located adjacent to Municipal Hall at 1229 Esquimalt Road.

"This is a milestone for our community," said Mayor Barbara Desjardins.
"Residents told us in the 2011 municipal election and through our Economic Development Strategy that the development of the EVP lands was a priority. We have laid the groundwork to find a partner to develop a new village concept in the core of our community – it's very exciting to be moving forward."

In May of this year the Township issued a Request for Expressions of Interest for the project. Results from this process indicated that there was sufficient interest from the development community to proceed to a Request for Proposals.



The Township is currently completing detailed site investigations to determine the degree to which contaminants are present within the property, the former location of the Township's Municipal Works Yard. Once this work is completed a remediation plan will be prepared for the site, leading to an Approval-in-Principle from the Ministry of Environment to proceed with remediation. The site has also undergone a geotechnical analysis, an archaeological assessment, and a survey to consolidate the site boundary.

Earlier this year the EVP lands were identified as a technically feasible location for a wastewater treatment facility by the Westside Wastewater

Treatment & Resource Recovery
Committee. The Township has notified
the Committee that the site is being
removed from further consideration for
this purpose.

The deadline for submissions to the RFP is December 10th, 2015. At that time Council will thoroughly review and consider all of the proposals and choose a partner that best responds to the needs of the community. Once a selection is made, a comprehensive engagement process will be developed to give the public a variety of ways to provide their input into shaping the final design.

Stay Up-To-Date on Westside Wastewater Treatment

Westside Solutions (the Westside Wastewater Treatment and Resource Recovery Select Committee) has been working since late 2014 to develop options for wastewater treatment and resource recovery. Thank you to residents who have taken the time to provide input during 2015.

Further public consultation will be sought during the period mid-November to January 15, 2016 on a variety of

solution sets featuring options for one, two, four or seven site configurations.

A report incorporating all public feedback and technical analysis will be provided to the CRD's Core Area Liquid Waste Management Committee for their consideration on January 27th, 2016 and a final solution set will be determined at that time.

Your input will continue to be important as plans progress. Determining where

Admirals Road: A Corridor for Everyone

What began many years ago as a trail linking the 900 acre Craigflower Farm to the "Admiral's House," a large house situated on Maplebank Road, has been transformed into a modern and safe multi-modal corridor thanks to the Admirals Road Corridor Improvement Project.

"We're looking at the end of November 2015 for substantial completion if the weather cooperates," said Engineering Manager Will Wieler. "I want to thank commuters and residents for their patience throughout the project."

Construction began in May 2015 with a \$2.8 million contribution from the Government of Canada through the Gas Tax Fund transfer for municipal infrastructure priorities. Before construction began the Township's Engineering Department solicited public



input into the design of the corridor through open houses and one-on-one meetings with interested members of the public.

Cyclists, many of whom took advantage of a bike detour around the project throughout the summer, can now enjoy a designated bike lane with a safety buffer along the corridor, with the option of transitioning onto the E&N Rail Trail at Colville or Maplebank. Additional features of the project include the addition of two-way left turn lanes, median islands, sidewalk improvements, and underground work including the installation of stormwater treatment devices and the separation of combined manholes for storm and sanitary collection systems.

Four New Playgrounds in Township Parks

New playground equipment has been added to four Esquimalt parks: Lugrin, Paradise, Memorial and Esquimalt's Gorge Park. The \$170,000 park upgrade includes modern equipment developed by Landscape Structures,

Inc. and supplied



and installed by Habitat Systems. The new equipment replaces outdated playground structures. Features of the new playground equipment include engineered wood fibre ground surfacing for improved safety and innovative and colourful designs.

Modifying your Boulevard Requires a Permit

Did you know that in order to change any of the landscaping on the boulevard in front of your residence you require a **Boulevard Alteration Permit? Like most** municipalities, the boulevard—the space between a residential property line and the curb —is designated municipal property in Esquimalt. Boulevards often have utilities running beneath them that crews occasionally need to access. They also need to be maintained to a minimum standard for traffic and pedestrian safety. Should you wish to modify the plantings or landscape in any way on the boulevard, please contact Engineering and Public Works at 250-414-7108.
