McLoughlin Amenity Funds: Thanks for your input!

After a comprehensive eight-month public engagment process, public input for use of the \$17M McLoughlin Point Amenity Reserve Funds is now being compiled and analyzed.

The Phase 2 online survey closed on September 23, 2018 with 1770 people participating. The engagement process also included an earlier online survey, an Ideas Fair, and an Ideas Wall located at Township facilities. A mobile engagement booth was also located at Township events throughout the summer months to provide additional opportunities for public input.

Once all of the information is compiled and tabulated by the project consultant in the fall of 2018, it will be made available to the public. Council, with input from a staff working group, will then complete a review of the public input, capital improvement priorities, and funding criteria in order to allocate the funding. Project ideas should benefit the entire community, meet diverse community needs, achieve multiple purposes and uses, support healthy lifestyle choices, and connect people to each other and the natural environment.

"From the beginning, the overriding goal of this project has been to identify amenities that provide the best overall value to the community," said CAO Laurie Hurst. "Input from residents is critical to achieving this goal, and we thank everyone who participated."

The negotiated agreement with the Capital Regional District clearly states how the Township is to use the funds: capital improvement projects in waterfront parks, recreation facilities, and a public safety facility.

All funds must be invested within roughly five years.

In January 2017, the CRD and the Township of Esquimalt agreed on an amenity funding package associated with locating the wastewater treatment plant at McLoughlin Point. A one-time CRD contribution of \$17 million—the McLoughlin Point Amenity Reserve Funds—will be used for capital projects in waterfront parks, recreation facilities, and a public safety facility.



Election 2018

The Local Government Election will take place in Esquimalt on October 20, 2018. A Mayor, six Councillors and nine School Trustees will be elected for a four year term.

In 2018, for the first time, Esquimalt will be using the Provincial Voters List to administer the election. If you are registered as an elector, you should already be on this list.

If you are not on the Voters' List, you will need to register at the polling station on voting day.

There will be two **advance voting opportunities** on October 10th and 17th, 2018, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. at Municipal Hall, Council Chambers, 1229 Esquimalt Road.

A special voting opportunity for residents of Sunset Lodge in Esquimalt will be held at the lodge on October 11th, 2018, 10 a.m. to noon.

General Voting Day is on October 20th, 2018, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. at Esquimalt Recreation Centre, 527 Fraser Street, Esquimalt.

Corridor Design: Lampson and Lyall

During July 2018, the Township of Esquimalt undertook a comprehensive study of its transportation system.

The overall goal of the study is to improve comfort and safety for all travel modes on the corridors—particularly cyclists and pedestrians—by improving active transportation facilities while retaining acceptable traffic movement and minimizing impacts on neighbourhood parking.

As part of this study, two online surveys were developed to gather input from residents on the Lampson Street and Lyall Street corridors. Some 600 people participated in the survey.

The surveys focused on the community's attitudes and preferences with respect to active transportation infrastructure on the corridors.


Data from the surveys will now be used to inform infrastructure design, including on-street parking, bike lanes, shared lane markings, and sidewalks.

An open house will be held on Thurday November 22 to present design renderings for Lyall Street. Engineering staff members and consultants will be on hand to answer questions.

Intersection Safety Improvements

A number of intersections will be improved in the Township this fall to make them safer for all users. Watch for crews working at the following locations:

Location	Improvements
Lampson and Colville Crosswalk Project	New sidewalks, crosswalk ramps, paint lines, and lighting.
Colville Sidewalk Ramp Project	New sidewalk grade to eliminate the steep ramp and a new crosswalk ramp.
Intervale and Lockley Project	New sidewalk grade to eliminate the existing stair case and a new crosswalk ramp.
Esquimalt at Grenville and Comerford Crosswalk	New sidewalk extensions at Grenville and Comerford, a new crosswalk at the intersection with overhead lighting and pedestrian activated flashing lights.
Esquimalt and Park Crosswalk Removal	Remove the existing crosswalk at the intersection of Esquimalt Road and Park Place.
Esquimalt and Municipal Hall Crosswalk Project	Add a new crosswalk on Esquimalt Road at the Municipal Hall. New concrete sidewalk on the north side of Esquimalt Road and improvements to the parking lot directly across from the hall.
Nelson Street Sidewalk Project	Install a new sidewalk on Nelson Street from Lyall Street to 477 Nelson Street on the east side of the road.

Township Recognized for Action on Climate Change for Sixth Straight Year

For the sixth year in a row, the Township of Esquimalt has been recognized by the joint Provincial-Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) Green Communities Committee as a BC Climate Action Community. The Township was awarded Level 3 recognition "Accelerating Progress on Charter Commitments" by taking significant action to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions for the 2017 reporting year.

As a signatory to the Climate Action Charter since October 2008, the Township has demonstrated its commitment to work with the Province and UBCM to take action on climate change and reduce GHG emissions in municipal operations and the community.

Actions taken include the LED street light replacement program, preparation of Official Community Plan policies to reduce greenhouse gasses and the installation of solar pedestrian beacons.

In 2017, the Township produced 1307 tonnes of GHG emissions with 75% of emissions coming from the operation of municipal buildings and the other 25% from the municipal fleet. The 2017 Climate Action Revenue Incentive Program (CARIP) Report - available on the Township website - highlights the progress and action being made towards reducing those emissions and meeting the Township's Charter goals.

Esquimalt Town Square Taking Shape

The Esquimalt Town Square project is taking shape, with the south buildings on the property along Carlisle Street rising above ground. The property has been branded with the tagline "Together is Everything," drawing attention to the community focus of the project, which will include an art walk, public square, new library, office and retail space, and market and rental housing. Housing will include 68 market units and 34 rental units. Leasable office space will comprise 37,000 square feet and commercial space will encompass over 4,300 square feet.

Once completed in 2020 there will be a total of 55 parking spaces available for visitors to the square's public facilities, and an additional 160 below-ground parking spaces for residents. To encourage green transportation options, a total of 251 bike parking spaces will also be available, and the square will have easy access to BC Transit.

Wednesday, November 14, 7 - 8 p.m.


This one hour presentation will discuss how to prepare you and your pet family for an emergency, including planning, what to expect, services available, and tips and tricks.

Deer Count Fall 2018

In conjunction with the Department of National Defence (DND), a second deer count will be conducted in the Township during the fall of 2018 by a contractor working with the Urban Wildlife Stewardship Society (UWSS).

The count is part of a multi-year, scientifically-based study that will establish an accurate estimate of the size of the local Columbian Black-tailed deer population.

Results from the study will determine whether the population is stable, increasing or decreasing.

The count is expected to take place during the rutting season, when deer are most active. Sampling should be completed during the period October 15 - November 30, 2018, and will include surveys along roadways, golf cart paths, and park trail segments. On each sampling day, surveys will be conducted for approximately two hours at both dawn and dusk.

Data collected will include photographs, GPS coordinates, distance and angle of sighting measurement, time of encounter, and the gender/age of each deer sampled. Sampling methodology and timing will be aligned with DND surveys to reduce the possibility of double counting deer. A third and final survey is planned for 2019.

UWSS has been busy with a public education campaign focussing on living with deer in the community over the summer of 2018. If you have questions about living with deer, please visit www.uwss.ca.
