

Esquimalt Village Project Update

Council has reviewed the Expressions of Interest submitted to the Township regarding the Esquimalt Village Project (EVP) and is satisfied that there is sufficient interest in the development community to proceed.

The next step in the process is to issue a Request for Proposal to potential developers with the ultimate goal of finding a partner to develop the site. The EVP is envisioned to be a lively and sustainable town centre, incorporating a mix of uses including an education institution and a new library.

Admirals Road on Schedule

The Admirals Road Corridor Improvement Project is on schedule, with a significant portion of the western end of the corridor completed.

Construction contractor Jacobs Brothers has been working to ensure that two lanes are open for traffic as much as possible, and the Township has been encouraging the use of a bike detour so that cyclists can avoid the construction zone.

"We would like to thank the public for the patience they have shown during construction," said Engineering Manager Will Wieler. "The contractor has been making real headway and we believe that the project will be substantially completed by the end of October 2015 as scheduled."

Work will continue south towards Lyall Street through the summer and early fall installing underground utilities and reconstructing the roadway to create median islands, bike lanes, a two-way left turn lane and improved sidewalks.

The project is proceeding thanks to a \$2.8 million contribution from the government of Canada through the Gas Tax Fund for municipal infrastructure priorities, and is part of the Township's commitment to multi-modal transportation.

Westside Solutions: Narrowing Down Options

Determining where and how to treat our wastewater is one of the most important decisions our region has faced in many years. Westside Solutions (the Westside Wastewater Treatment and Resource Recovery Select Committee) has been working since late 2014 to develop options for wastewater treatment and resource recovery. To accomplish this, the committee has been working on two tracks: technical assessment and public engagement. The combined efforts of these two processes have resulted in the identification of potential sites for further public consideration and refinement.

Public input will continue to help shape the outcome of the process by narrowing down the initial list to the best options for all communities in the Westside. These best options will undergo more detailed technical and financial analysis.

Esquimalt Road Revitalization

As part of an ongoing renewal of Esquimalt Road, the Township is establishing a Revitalization Tax Exemption (RTE) Bylaw as an incentive for businesses and properties to beautify the corridor while also supporting heritage conservation.

The Bylaw will provide partial property tax relief to approved properties for new construction and improvements and applies to commercial, mixed use and multifamily buildings (with four or more units).

The revitalization area includes properties located within 150 metres of the Esquimalt Road corridor between Dominion Road and Canteen Road.

The initiative is part of Esquimalt's Economic Development Strategy, which identified a number of strategies and actions for promoting economic growth and creating a welcoming climate for businesses and property owners.

An open house was held in March to gather input from local businesses and residents on what type of incentives would appeal to them, and input was also solicited from an online feedback form. This input provided vital information for the staff report and the new Bylaw, which has received third reading from Council and is expected to be adopted on August 17, 2015.

Proposed Tax Exemption Process for Eligible Properties

- Owner of eligible property submits application to Township
- Township reviews application and forwards to Council for decision
- If approved, property owner and the Township enter into an agreement
- Owner submits building permit application within six months of agreement being signed
- 5 Owner completes project construction within 12 months of building permit being issued
- Township issues Revitalization Tax Exemption Certificate for the property
