1. CALL TO ORDER

Councillor Hundleby, Chair, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. She welcomed Tom Day, Chief Administrative Officer, returning back to work from an extended leave.

The Director of Development Services provided an overview of a change in zoning from RM-4 to CD No. 66 and a development permit. Staff have worked with the applicants and are pleased with the proposal.

The applicants, Mr. Glen Davies and Mr. Brian Kendrick, Metro urban design & development, were present. Mr. Davies advised that they had originally approached the Gellings in March 2008 and the Gellings had signed off on the development. They made it known that they had concerns with privacy. The applicants made amendments which the Gellings signed off on April 30. Mr. Davies stated that they will continue to work with the Gellings to resolve outstanding issues.

PUBLIC INPUT

(1) Russell Gelling, 869 Phoenix Street

Mr. Gelling does not oppose the development. He expressed concerns regarding the following issues:

- location of the patio, he has concerns with privacy of his family;
- height, he would like to see the building left at the same height; and
- preservation of trees, there are three trees on his property which may be affected by this development.

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Desjardins that Bylaw No. 2680 which would amend Zoning Bylaw No. 2050, by changing the zoning designation of 875 Phoenix Street [Lot AM3, Section 10, Esquimalt District, Plan 276] from RM-4 (Multiple Family Residential) to CD No. 66 (Comprehensive Development District No. 66) be given final reading and adoption.

The motion **CARRIED**.

Moved by Councillor Desjardins, seconded by Councillor Sterk that Development Permit No. 03/2008 not be approved until the applicant resolves tree protection and privacy issues with the neighbour.

(2) Hearing for Development Variance Permit, 566 Head Street and 901 Wollaston Street [Lots A and B, Section 11, Esquimalt District, Plan VIP65285], Staff Report No. DEV-08-038

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Desjardins that Development Variance Permit No. 02/2008 authorizing a variance to the lot coverage as shown on plans provided by Island Land Surveying Ltd. and stamped "Received March 3, 2008" and including the following relaxation to Zoning Bylaw No. 2050 be approved, issued and registered on the title of Lots A and B. Section 11, Esquimalt District, Plan VIP65285 [566 Head Street and 901 Wollaston Street].

Bylaw No. 2050, Section 67.7(5) – Lot Coverage – a 2.7% increase to the maximum permitted Lot Coverage from 38.4% to 41.1%.

(1) C. Joe Richards Re: The Number of Parks, Greenways, Open Spaces, Waterways and Beach Accesses in Esquimalt.

> Mr. Richards presented a map of Esquimalt Parks and Recreation facilities. He noted that many parks were named after former Reeves, Aldermen, and pioneers. He suggested

that Colville Park be renamed Boulton Park in honour of Councillor Basil Boulton who passed away in January 2008. He will be starting a petition to have this park renamed and will bring it back to Council.

Mr. Richards stated that he is pleased that something is going to be done with the E&N railway stop. The first railroad engines and the first railway spike driven was in Esquimalt.

(4) Stop Gap Policy for the Prevention of Demolition of Heritage Places, Staff Report No. DEV-08-035.

Comments from Council include:

- The staff report is very useful.
- Concerns were raised with timelines to prevent demolition of heritage properties in future.
- Reported that there is an inventory of heritage homes dating from 1984 which Development Services is aware of.
- Suggestion was made to include checklist for heritage designation for properties slated for demolition.
- There is no protection for heritage properties other than Heritage Designation.

(5) Development Variance Permit, 511 Constance Avenue [Lot K, Esquimalt District, Plan 2854, Suburban Lot 38, Except Under 224], Staff Report No. DEV-08-036

Moved by Councillor Desjardins, seconded by Councillor Linge that Development Variance Permit No. 10/2007 authorizing construction as shown on plans submitted with the application and stamped "Received December 12, 2007" and as detailed in the BCLS Certificate prepared by Island Land Surveying Ltd. stamped "Received April 18, 2008" and including the following relaxations to Zoning Bylaw No. 2050 and Parking Bylaw No. 2011 be approved, issued and registered on the title of Lot K, Esquimalt District, Plan 2854, Suburban Lot 38, Exempt Under 224 (511 Constance Ave).

Bylaw No. 2050, Section 58(4)(a) – <u>Siting</u> Requirements - Front Setback – a 5.3 metre variance to the required front setback from 7.5 metres to 2.2 metres.

Bylaw No. 2050, Section 58(4)(c) – Siting Requirements - Rear Setback – a 1.1 metre variance to the required rear setback from 7.5 metres to 6.4 metres.

Bylaw No. 2011, Section 13(1)(d)(i) – <u>Parking Requirements</u> - <u>Number of Off-Street Parking Spaces</u> – a reduction in the minimum number of required off-street Parking Spaces required from 11 spaces to 6 spaces.

(1) Valerie Elliott, 821 Craigflower Road

Ms. Elliott addressed council regarding a noise issue at Craigflower Foods, 811 Craigflower Road. The store has installed a compressor which is very loud. Bob Haveruk, Bylaw Enforcement Officer, had requested that the equipment be removed. However, the noise level has remained the same and the neighbours are not happy with it. BC Hydro has also

attended the site regarding hydro power surges. Ms. Elliott suggested that Council acquire equipment to measure noise levels. The Director of Development Services responded that staff are currently looking into gaining access to this type of equipment.

(2) C. Joe Richards

Mr. Richards reported that he will be attending a transit meeting tomorrow, May 6 to recommend double decker buses on the Esquimalt bus route.
