1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Desjardins called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

2. LATE ITEMS

Add letter from Jean Jenkins and email from Jo-Anne Monahan under item 9 (5) and verbal report from Councillor Garrison on the cross town bus route under item 10 (1).

3. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that the agenda as amended be approved.

5. PUBLIC INPUT (On items listed on the Agenda)

- (1) Terry Prentice, 1297 Rockcrest Avenue stated that if the OCP review is allowed to proceed it will detract from the citizens of the municipality. The only review that should occur is the question of the 10-storey maximum building height. Council needs to determine what the electorate wants. Leave the rest of the OCP review until a thorough review happens.
- (2) Muriel Dunn, 1193 Old Esquimalt Road says she sent letters to all of Council about the OCP review. She provided general comments about the OCP review issue and feels a review is not needed at this time.
- (3) Joanne Kimm, 654 Grenville Avenue says that there is confusion about the OCP review and that more public input is needed if it proceeds. Ms. Kimm also submitted an email letter which was part of Staff Report DEV-09-11 which is part of the agenda to this meeting.
- (4) Rod Laverne, 485 Fraser Street says that the only question respecting the OCP that should be asked is "do we want to allow buildings higher than 10 storeys?" He stated that another consultant is not needed. The other issues in the OCP can wait until a thorough OCP review occurs in the future.

(5) Chris Zegger-Murphy, 1046 Colville Road is concerned about the traffic at Tillicum and Colville Road especially. He urged Council to use traffic calming measures when planning for Colville Road.

(3) Hearing for Development Permit with Variance, 630 Head Street [Lot 1, Section 11, Esquimalt District, Plan 29010], Staff Report No. DEV-09-010

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Brame that the application for a Development Permit, limiting the form and character of development to that shown on architectural plans prepared by Praxis Architects Inc., stamped "Received November 24, 2008", and including the following variance to

Zoning Bylaw No. 2050, be **approved**, **issued** and **registered** on the title of Lot 1, Section 11, Esquimalt District, Plan 29010 [630 Head Street].

Section 44(4)(a) – <u>Building Height</u> – a 2.8 metre increase in the permitted Height of the Principal Building, from 11 metres to 13.8 metres.

(4) Hearing for Development Variance Permit, 929 Mesher Place [Lot 4, Section 2, Esquimalt District, Plan 30973]

Moved by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Garrison that the application for a Development Variance Permit authorizing the siting of an existing, non-conforming, deck as shown on the site survey prepared by J.E. Anderson and Associates stamped "Received November 19, 2008", and including the following variance to Zoning Bylaw No. 2050, be approved, issued and registered on the title of Lot 4, Section 2, Esquimalt District, Plan 30973 [929 Mesher Place].

Section 34(9)(a)(i) – <u>Siting Requirements – Principal Building – Front Setback</u> - a 1.3 metre reduction to the required Front Setback for a principal building from 7.5 metres to 6.2 metres The motion **CARRIED.**

Ms. Meggs spoke about the need for more early morning and late night bus trips, more trips and routes to the western communities, more express routes and the need for more linkages between college and university campuses. She asked for Council's support in efforts to improve bus service in greater Victoria.

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Mayor Desjardins that staff contact the Hill family and the community on the idea of renaming either the small park at Colville and Admirals, the Town Square, the Westbay Walkway or the new playground at Memorial Park in honour of Ken Hill and to report back to Council.

The motion CARRIED.

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that staff investigate the disposition of the property at the corner of Grafton and Lyall Streets which is currently being considered for development into a park named after Ken Hill and that consideration also be given to leasing the land and any other feasible revenue-generating options that may exist.

Moved by Councillor Brame, seconded by Councillor Garrison that by the Township of Esquimalt voluntarily signing the non-binding BC Climate Action Charter, it is recommended that:

- 2. Council recognize and support the anticipated timelines to achieve Charter commitments.
- 3. Council provide budget support in order to meet the Charter commitments.

Moved by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Brame that Council adopt Council Policy Admin-46 as the Township of Esquimalt Symbols usage policy.

Parks and Recreation

(3) Tree Removal Permit #1175 at 1107 Bewdley Avenue, Staff Report No. P&R-09-003

Moved by Councillor Gaul, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that Ms. Linda Barnes be granted the opportunity to address

Council respecting her appeal of a staff decision to deny issuing a tree-cutting permit.

The motion CARRIED.

Ms. Barnes explained that the trees in question are the wrong trees in the wrong place. The large Deodora Cedar in the front yard of her property oozes a sticky sap which is destructive to everything around and is a non-native species.

She further stated that if Council allows removal of the trees she will work with the Parks and Recreation Department to replace them with more appropriate trees. Both existing trees are water-intensive.

Ms. Barnes written submission on the matter is attached to Staff Report No. P&R-09-003.

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that Council consider approval of the request to remove the Deodora Cedar on the condition that the applicant reaches an agreement with the Parks and Recreation Department with respect to replacing the tree and that Council review the agreement before final approval is considered.

The motion CARRIED.

Moved by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Brame that the request to remove the large cedar tree in the back yard of the property be denied.

Moved by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Brame that discussion on removal of the tree in the back yard be postponed until a staff report which includes information on the neighbours' views on the matter is presented to Council.

The motion CARRIED.

Mayor Desjardins called a short recess at 8:30 p.m. Mayor Desjardins re-convened the meeting at 8:39 p.m.

- (2) Emmy Labonte, 873 Dunsmuir Road spoke about tents in public parks and that the City of Victoria is introducing a Bylaw to prevent it. She asked if Esquimalt has such a Bylaw. The Chief Administrative Officer explained that Esquimalt does not and that the UBCM is appealing the recent court decision on the matter.
