## 1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Desjardins called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

#### 2. LATE ITEMS

There was one late item: 7 (8) Appointment of Deputy Approving Officer, Staff Report No. ADM-10-21

#### 3. APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Brame, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that the Agenda be approved as amended. The motion **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** 

#### 4. MINUTES

(1) Minutes of the Regular Meeting of Council, March 1, 2010

Page 4: item 11(1): Councillor Gaul was in a conflict due to her employment with VIHA, not Ministry of Health as noted.

Page 6: item (7) delete the first sentence of the second paragraph that reads "Mayor Desjardins stated that the Committee's Plan will go to BC Transit and then to the CRD for approval".

Page 8: Delete the first sentence which starts with "Mr. Lavergne" and replace with "Mr. Lavergne commented on Council's initiative to contribute to Our Place early morning initiative.

Mayor Desjardins called for public input.

<u>Lorne Argyle</u> of Bewdley Avenue noted that Access Awareness Day is the same day as the ALS Flower Day. He also asked for clarification on the total project cost of the Admirals/Colville Intersection project.

John Noyes of Garthland Road commented on the March 8, 2010 Minutes of the Committee of the Whole referring to the Craigflower Road Phase 1 issues and suggested wording changes for the two recommendations. Mr. Noyes asked if some of the \$1.5 million in surplus could be used to build a small sidewalk from the Ironwood development to Garthland. Mayor Desjardins responded that any works would have to fall within the boundaries defined by the grant funding, which staff will look into.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

#### (1) PUBLIC HEARING – ZONING BYLAW AMENDMENT [RECOVERY HOMES]

Mayor Desjardins called the Public Hearing to order at 7:10 p.m.

Director Snyder gave a general overview of the recovery homes process and stated the general purpose of the amendments are to ensure that dwelling units cannot be used as recovery houses unless they are zoned appropriately. A specific zone will be added to the Zoning Bylaw when an application for recovery home comes forward and is approved.

Mayor Desjardins called three times for public input. Hearing none, the Public Hearing was adjourned at 7:15 p.m.

#### 7. PUBLIC HEARING STAFF REPORT

(2) Recovery Homes, Staff Report No. DEV-10-022

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Garrison that Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050, Amendment Bylaw [No. 186], 2009, No. 2705, which would amend Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050 by changing the definition of "Family" to exclude residents of a Recovery Home and add a new definition for "Recovery Home", be given third reading and adoption.

The motion **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.

## 8. STAFF REPORTS

Administration

(1) Earth Hour 2010, Staff Report No. ADM-10-018

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Brame, seconded by Councillor Gaul that Council proclaim the Township of Esquimalt's participation and support of Earth Hour on March 27, 2010 at 8:30 p.m. by turning off non-essential lights in municipal buildings and promoting Earth Hour to residents and businesses. The motion **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.

(2) Community Gardens Task Force – Report # 2, Staff Report No. ADM-10-019

Sustainability Coordinator Lagoa stated since the writing of her report, a meeting was held with the eight enthusiastic

applicants on March 11<sup>th</sup>. The Committee is very dynamic, having held five meetings in February. Potential sites for community gardens will be brought forward to the Committee of the Whole meeting scheduled for April 12<sup>th</sup>.

Request was made to bring the official names of the applicants to the next Council meeting so they can be formally appointed.

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Brame, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that Council receive Staff Report No. ADM-10-019, Community Gardens Task Force Report #2, for information. The motion **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.

(3) Solar BC – Solar Communities Program, Staff Report No. ADM-10-020

Sustainability Coordinator Lagoa gave an overview of the SolarBC Program grant funding process, noting that the complete application will be brought back to the April 6<sup>th</sup> Council meeting for approval.

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Garrison, seconded by Councillor Brame that Council support the Township of Esquimalt submitting an application to become a Solar Community under the SolarBC Program.

#### Discussion:

Council commented that some monies could be used for public education and community engagement and liked the idea of promoting solar hot water heating by giving a small token grant to assist people who purchase a system.

THE QUESTION WAS CALLED ON THE MOTION AND DECLARED **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.

**Development Services** 

(4) Timeline for Consideration of Bylaw No. 2730 Amending the Official Community Plan Regarding Height and Density, Staff Report No. DEV-10-021

Director Synder stated her recommendation for Option 3 timeline will not work with everyone's schedule and is therefore proposing Option 2.

Mayor Desjardins stated she is unavailable April 26<sup>th</sup> and Councillor Linge is the Acting Mayor.

Councillor Hundleby put forward a motion, seconded by Councillor Linge that Council approve Option 2 as the timeline.

Discussion:

Councillor Garrison stated he is unavailable on May 10<sup>th</sup>.

Councillor Hundleby and Councillor Linge consented to changing Option 2 to Option 1.

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Linge that Council approve Option 1 as the timeline for consideration of "Official Community Plan Bylaw, 2006, No. 2646, Amendment Bylaw [No. 6], 2010. The motion **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.

Engineering and Public Works

(5) Amendments to Streets and Traffic Regulation Bylaw, 2005, No. 2607, Staff Report No. EPW-10-007

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that Council approve the following:

- 1. That the Streets and Traffic Regulation Bylaw, 2005, No. 2067 be amended as follows: Reducing the speed limit to 40 km/hr on Craigflower Road from Dominion Road to Admirals Road.
- 2. That Streets and Traffic Regulation Bylaw 2005, No. 2607, Amendment Bylaw [No. 6], 2010, No. 2729 be given first, second and third reading.

Discussion:

Council noted that signage alerting drivers of the new speed, or a lit sign similar to that near Camosun College, would assist drivers adjust. Posting in the community newsletter was also suggested. Staff was asked to notify Inspector McLean and see if a grace period where warnings only were issued is feasible.

THE QUESTION WAS CALLED ON THE MOTION AND DECLARED CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

(6) Contract Award – Craigflower Road Corridor Upgrades Phase 2, Staff Report No. EPW-10-008

Council commented on the \$1.5 million grant funding available for additional work and asked staff to bring back a report on options to use the funds. Suggestions given included works that were not able to be done in Phase 1, lighting at bus stops, and relocating the bus stop at Garthland Street to within Phase 2.

Director Miller stated that the criteria for tender awards are set in the contract and MMCD [Master Municipal Construction Documents] tender documents are used. Aggressive Excavating performed the works in Phase 1. <u>Moved</u> by Councillor Linge, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that Council go *In Camera* at 8:44 p.m. pursuant to Section 90 of the *Community Charter* to discuss information that is prohibited from disclosure under section 21 of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* pursuant to Section 90 (1) (j) and that the general public be excluded.

Council reconvened the Regular Meeting at 8:47 p.m.

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor Brame, seconded by Councillor Hundleby that the construction contract for Craigflower Road Corridor Upgrades Phase 2 be awarded to Aggressive Excavating for the sum of \$2,715,329.45 excluding the GST. The motion **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.

Finance

Councillors Hundleby and Gaul declared themselves in a conflict of interest due to their employment and left Council Chambers at 8:10 p.m.

<u>Moved</u> by Councillor McIldoon, seconded by Mayor Desjardins that Mayor Desjardins and Esquimalt Council send a letter of support to the Provincial Ministers of Health, the Solicitor General, Dr. Perry Kendall and VIHA, supporting the following recommendations made by the Centre for Addictions Research of BC and Dr. Perry Kendall, to reduce the public safety and health concerns associated with problematic alcohol use in our society.

1. Reduce the price of low alcohol content beverages and increase the price of high alcohol content beverages.

2. Set a minimum price per standard drink, \$1.50 in the liquor store and \$3.00 in a bar or restaurant. The minimum price for a bottle of wine would be \$7.80; \$9.00 for a six-pack of beer and \$26 for a bottle of spirits.

3. Tax wine and beer products sold at u-vin and u-brew outlets.

4. Index the price of alcohol to inflation.

Discussion ensued on the relevance of municipal government setting liquor prices which is the purview of provincial government.

THE QUESTION WAS CALLED ON THE MOTION AND DECLARED **CARRIED** with Mayor Desjardins, Councillors McIldoon, Linge, Brame In Favour and Councillor Garrison Opposed.

Councillors Hundleby and Gaul returned to Council Chambers at 8:14 p.m.

13. PUBLIC QUESTION AND COMMENT PERIOD

<u>Excluding</u> items which are or have been the subject of a Public Hearing.

<u>Barbara Noyes</u> of Garthland Road asked why the public has to wait until the next Committee of the Whole meeting in April for Council to discuss the safety issues concerning the unmarked crosswalk that was in Craigflower Road Phase 1. She noted the non completion of the road marking is causing a serious deficiency in pedestrian safety. Mrs. Noyes also spoke to the signage obliterating the vision of pedestrians using the crosswalk at Forshaw Road, compounded by the fact that the crosswalk is at the bottom of a hill and motorists tend to increase their speed as they are descending. Mrs. Noyes implored Council to give direction to the Engineer to immediately correct this dangerous situation.

**14.** <u>Moved</u> by Councillor Hundleby, seconded by Councillor Garrison that Council convene *In Camera* pursuant to Section 90 of the *Community Charter* and that the general public be excluded. The motion **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**.
