# 5. PRESENTATIONS

(1) Scott Seivewright, 2011 Victoria Police Budget

The Mayor acknowledged Scott Seivewright, Deputy Chief Del Manak and Chief of Police Jamie Graham who were in attendance to make a presentation regarding the 2011 Victoria Police budget. She noted Donna Humphries and Graham Lang from the Esquimalt Policing Advisory Board were also present.

Chief Graham provided an overview of expenses for the year, reviewed some of the issues facing the police force and summarized service levels in Esquimalt. He also made reference to statistical data for the Victoria/Esquimalt area and how the police force stood in relation to other forces in the province.

Scott Seivewright provided a power point presentation. He indicated that the proposal is to increase the police budget by 5.42% for 2011. This increase would allow for the creation of 6 new staff positions and other possible increases such as wages and operation/capital expenses. Esquimalt's contribution would be an additional \$462,747.

Comments from the Mayor and Councillors regarding the presentation:

- Acknowledgement of the great work of the police men and women serving in Esquimalt and of the contribution of Inspector McLean.
- Funding formula continues to be an issue
- The 5 year forecast results in between a 25% to 30% increase which is not sustainable
- Transparency of budget expenditures
- Lack of information regarding the police direction/strategic vision

Chief Graham agreed that a presentation on the strategic plan could be arranged for Esquimalt Council.

(2) Shamus McGrath, Ryder Hesjedal's Tour de Victoria

Barry Lycett presented on behalf of Shamus McGrath. This the first event of the Victoria International Cycling festival and is a mass ride to take place May 28<sup>th</sup>, 2011. The ride will pass through Esquimalt between approximately 7:05 and 7:10 am, and again at 8:05 to 8:10 am. The organizing committee also has appropriate insurance coverage for the event. A further update will be available after March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2011 and residents and businesses along the corridor will be notified soon thereafter.

# 7. HEARING

(1) HEARING – DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT [630 HEAD STREET]

Mayor Desjardins called the Public Hearing for Development Variance Permit [630 Head Street] to order at 8:10 p.m.

Barbara Snyder, Director of Development Services, noted there was no change to the use of the property or parking, it was simply to put a covering over three parking spaces and the south side entrance to the building.

The Mayor called for public input:

Don Graham, Head Street, spoke in favour of the application. The current building owners have increased their active management considerably.

The Mayor called three more times for public input. Hearing none, the Public Hearing on Development Variance Permit [630 Head Street] was declared closed at 8:17 p.m.

(2) PUBLIC HEARING – DEVELOPMENT VARIANCE PERMIT [948 ARAL ROAD]

Mayor Desjardins called the Public Hearing for Development Variance Permit [948 Aral Road] to order at 8:17 p.m.

*Brad Cunnin*, Land surveyor spoke on behalf of the owner. He advised that the owner has agreed to restrict vehicle access off Craigflower. He hadn't been able to speak with the neighbours but plans to do so to address their concerns.

The Mayor called for public input. The Mayor noted that two letters of opposition had been received from the public regarding this application

Mayor Desjardins called three more times for public input. Hearing none, the Public Hearing on Development Variance Permit [948 Aral Road] was declared closed at 8:21 p.m.

## 8. HEARING STAFF REPORTS

(1) Development Variance Permit, 630 Head Street, [Lot 1, Section 11, Esquimalt District, Plan 29010] Staff Report No. DEV-11-009.

**MOTION**: That the application for a Development Variance Permit authorizing the construction shown on the attached site plan stamped "Received November 22, 2010", and including the following variance, at Lot 1 Section 11 Esquimalt District Plan 29010 [630 Head Street] be approved, issued and registered on the title of Lot 1, Section 11, Esquimalt District Plan 29010[630 Head Street]

Zoning Bylaw 1992, No. 2050, Section 44(5)(a) – <u>Lot Coverage</u> – a five percent (5%) increase to the thirty percent (30%) lot coverage limit for all Principle Buildings, Accessory Buildings and Structures, ie. from 30% to 35%.

MOVED/ SECONDED. Councillor Garrison/Councillor Hundleby. **CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.** 

(2) Development Variance Permit, 948 Aral Road, [Proposed lot occupying the northernmost 540 square metres of parent parcel Lot 12, Section 2, Esquimalt District, Plan 5837] Staff Report No. DEV-11-010.

**MOTION**: That the application for a Development Variance Permit reducing the required Front Setback for a Principal Building for the proposed lot occupying the northernmost 540 square metres of parent parcel Lot 12, Section 2, Esquimalt District, Plan 5837 [948 Aral Road] as detailed on the site plan

prepared by Brad Cunnin Land Surveying, stamped "Received December 1, 2010", including the following relaxation to Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050, be approved, subject to registration of a covenant on the property title prohibiting driveway access from Craigflower Road for the proposed Lot A, i.e., that access be from Aral Road only; issued; and registered on the title of the proposed lot occupying the northernmost 540 square metres [legal description not yet established], of parent parcel Lot 12, Section 2, Esquimalt District, Plan 5837 [948 Aral Road]

Zoning Bylaw, 1992, No. 2050, Section 34(9)(a)(i) – Front Setback – a 2.0 metre reduction to the required setback for a Principal Building from the Front Lot.

MOVED/SECONDED. Councillor Garrison/Councillor Gaul. **CARRIED** (Councillors Gaul, Brame and Garrison In favour. Mayor Desjardins and Councillor Hundleby opposed).

Barbara Snyder, Director of Development Services, indicated that both resulting parcels are well over the minimum lot size. By varying the setbacks it would allow for a building that more closely resembles a house, rather than having an irregular style building. RS1 zoning also allows for a secondary suite.

- 3. That the organizer pay for any costs associated with the Tour de Victoria event;
- 4. That no costs are to be incurred by the Township; and
- 5. That the public be informed of this event by posting in the news section of the municipal website starting May 1<sup>st</sup>.
